Tabitha's Proposed Apartment Building at 47th & L St. --Topic of August Meeting--

Please join us August 5th for our monthly meeting at 7:00 p.m. to learn more about Tabitha's Intergenerational living community. Joyce Ebmeier, Sr. Vice President, Strategic Planning, will provide an update on this project and be available to answer our questions. This living community, an apartment building with 127 units, will be a home for Seniors (65+) and health science students affiliated with Bryan College of Health Sciences. Current plans call for a four story building with primarily underground parking for 120 vehicles. The building will be erected between 47th & 48th Streets along L St. The main entrance will be off of 47th St. As a part of the funding for this project, Tabitha will be seeking a blighted designation for a corridor beginning at L St and continuing south to A St, primarily covering an area between 46th - 48th Streets.

We have heard from you and know many of you have questions about this project, including the meaning and implications of the blighted designation.

The meeting will be held at Tabitha, 4720 Randolph St, LifeQuest Conference Room. Please enter through the South Main Entrance - off of Randolph St. As a Senior Health Care provider, Tabitha continues COVID-19 precautions. As you enter the building, you will be asked to complete a brief screening, to include answering a few questions and the recording of body temperature. Tabitha staff will greet you and assist with this process. Masks will be available and are required as you walk to and from the LifeQuest Conference Room. Currently, those vaccinated may remove their mask once seated in the conference room. Please don't hesitate to reach out if you have any questions about meeting logistics or about the project. Neighborhood Watch Topic of June Meeting



For our June meeting, Officer Jason Hellmuth spoke to our group. Officer Hellmuth has been with the Lincoln Police Department for 21 years and is currently the Neighborhood Watch team leader. During his presentation, he

emphasized good relations with neighbors as the best way to have safer neighborhoods. By building trust between neighbors, this allows for neighbors watching out for neighbors' homes during absences to help cut down on crime. A stronger community is the result. There are currently 424 neighborhood watch groups in Lincoln. There is a need for coordinators whose primary job is to distribute emails from LPD to neighbors keeping them abreast of current happenings. Statistics show a 16% decrease in crime when the neighborhood has an active neighborhood watch presence.

Other ways of helping lower crime were discussed, including making sure that doors to houses remain locked, including the screen door, when leaving the house open; keeping your garage door closed and locked when you are away from it; and keeping vehicle doors locked and keys removed from the ignition when away from the vehicle. These are all easy ways to stop items from be stolen from your property.

Officer Hellmuth shared crimemapping.com with us, which shows the recent crimes committed in your neighborhood. You can sign up to have an email sent to you when new crimes occur.

Officer Hellmuth also shared that LPD is currently

looking for recruits. There is no age cutoff, so you can apply to join the force at any age! Recruitment for the July class has ended with three hiring sessions completed. The hiring cycle lasts six to nine months. New recruits receive 22 weeks of in classroom training and five and a half months of field training.

Want to get to know your local law enforcement better? National Night Out is August 3rd. Everyone is encouraged to turn on their porch lights and spend the evening outdoors getting to know their neighbors and law enforcement personnel. Additionally, programs like "Pop with a Cop" and "Coffee with a Cop" should be returning soon. Officers are also able and willing to show up at block parties, if requested.



Yard of the Month

5500 L Street is the residence of the Bechtolt family, who moved there 45 years ago. They were the second owners of the ranch style home on a corner lot, with about one-third of the lot dedicated to a shade garden, lovingly developed over the years by Barb Bechtolt.

When I asked Duane Bechtolt what he liked best about the location, he answered simply, "the neighbors." That's an answer heard frequently in Witherbee area neighborhoods. He and Barb raised three children who attended both public and parochial schools. Duane worked for and retired from Nash Finch. Barb had worked at a doctor's office, as well as volunteering for Election Boards on a regular basis. Sadly, she passed away last year, so the yard of the month sign has been placed in her honor. Duane ended our call with a thank you for that honor.

The large area shaded by two huge oak trees features hostas, punctuated with patches of bright blue lobelia, pink blossomed lamium, Siberian irises, perennial geraniums, and feeders and houses for birds. On the east side of the yard is a huge tree trunk which sports a lovely planter and gazing ball every spring. Other perennial plantings accent a fence, a brick planter near the entrance, and by the sidewalk leading up to the front door. Many thanks to Duane for keeping his wife's memory alive for appreciative neighbors.



Historic Woods Park Perimeter Tour

Ed Zimmer, Lincoln Historian will share his knowledge about Woods Park and the perimeter surrounding the park, Sunday, October 10th with residents of Witherbee and Woods Park neighborhoods. Woods Tennis Center Expansion Topic of September Meeting

Kevin Heim, Executive Director of the Woods Tennis Center will present plans for further renovations as a part of Phase 2 of the Woods Tennis Center improvements at our September 2nd meeting. Kevin began working at Woods in 2008 as the Head Pro. In 2009 he added the position of General Manager and in 2010 was named Executive Director. Under his direction, Woods Tennis Center has expanded its wheelchair, club and USTA leagues, partnered with Lincoln Parks & Rec to bring tennis lessons to City Rec Centers and Community Learning Centers, and significantly increased its junior tournament participation. Heim helped lead the "Taking the Game to the Community" capital campaign raising \$6.6 million that allowed for the replacement of the aging bubbles with a new permanent 6 court indoor structure and upgrade of the outdoor plaza and courts. Since the completion of Phase 1 of the project, Kevin has continued to attend WNA meetings to keep us up to date on the happenings at Woods Tennis Center. Visions for Phase 2 of the project are now beginning to be presented to the public. The Phase 2 plan, as approved previously by WNA, is under review for revisions and updates to be responsive to current conditions and community needs. Kevin will review the Phase 2 plan as it was previously approved and present the proposed revisions and expansions of Phase 2 which includes additional indoor and outdoor


While several picked up litter another group of volunteers made house calls and picked up items from neighbors that were not able to haul their items to the collection site.

Those participating set their own hours and listed items they wanted advertised. Those who registered were given a copy of all WNA garage sales to pass on to their attendees. Garage sale attendees were appreciative of the listing for not just the information that was shared but also found the listing to be a useful tool for searching and saving time. This listing also allowed attendees to view either on Facebook, Nextdoor or the Witherbee website a neighborhood map correlated by number to each registered location on that listing.
